

Study Guide – Remembering Redemption: The Passover Fulfilled in Christ

Big Idea

The Lord's Supper calls God's redeemed people to remember that the salvation once promised through shadows and types has been fully accomplished in Jesus Christ.

Teaching Points & Reflection Questions

1. God Establishes Memorials to Help His People Remember

- Why does God repeatedly command His people to remember His works?
- How does communion function as a memorial today?

2. Sin Is Pervasive, but Sanctification Is Real

- How does leaven illustrate the nature of sin?
- What does it look like to actively “put off” sin in daily life?

3. Salvation Is God's Work, Not Ours

- How do rest and obedience coexist in the Christian life?
- Why is faith never alone, yet never replaced by works?

4. Redemption Begins a Journey

- What does it mean to live as a pilgrim or sojourner?
- How should readiness for Christ's return shape our priorities?

5. Christ Is the Fulfillment of Every Shadow

- How does Christ's sacrifice differ from Old Testament sacrifices?
- Why is it important to approach the Lord's Table with reverence and discernment?

- Spend time in prayerful self-examination before participating in communion.
- Reflect on areas where repentance and renewed obedience are needed.
- Rejoice in the sufficiency of Christ's atoning work and live in grateful worship.
